## Snowmobile Season Coming Soon

Are your snowmobiles ready? Fall is a great time to get your sleds ready for the winter season, so when the snow finally arrives you can focus on hitting the trails and having fun.

We recommend everyone gives their snowmobiles a thorough inspection and tune up each fall. A well maintained snowmobile will perform better, last longer, be safer, and save you time during the snow season. Plus, doing it in the fall means you won't freeze your fingers and you'll have time to order parts!

Some tips:

- Do a thorough visual inspection of your snowmobile. Look for damaged or cracked structure, leaks, worn or bent parts, etc. Make sure to have a good look underneath the hood and through the undercarriage too.
- Check all fluid levels and replace any fluids and filters that are due for replacement.
- Check belts and chains for condition and proper tension.
- Check track, sliders, skis and skags are in good shape and replace any parts that are worn out.
- Make sure all your lights and reflectors are working.
- Check engine runs good and spark plugs are clean.
- Grease all grease points.
- Check your on board tools and spare parts to make sure everything is there and in good condition.
- Make sure your helmet, goggles, and other safety gear is clean, good condition and up-to-date.
- Check your first aid kit and survival kit making sure they are well stocked and relace anything missing or expiring.
- Make sure your local snowmobile club membership is up to date.

This is just a quick guideline for reference. Always check your snowmobile's owners manual for proper checklists and servicing schedules for your particular snowmobile.

If you have any questions, need any parts, or would like a professional to check your snowmobile for you, we highly recommend you swing by one of our local snowmobile dealers. The Yukon has local dealers for all major snowmobile brands and they'll be happy to help you with anything your snowmobile may need. Local dealers are often big supporters of snowmobile club volunteers, so by shopping local you're not only supporting local businesses but you're also supporting local
